DAVID DAHMS COACH OF THE YEAR AWARD

David Dahms was an instrumental leader in the creation of what is now known as the USBC Junior Gold program. He joined the Young American Bowling Alliance in 1993 to manage the organization's Tenpin University coaching program and recognized the need for coaches to work with teenage bowlers to develop their skills for greater chances of success in the collegiate, national team and professional bowling realms. Dahms envisioned YABA's Junior Olympic Gold program as a training ground and feeder system, with the Junior Gold Championships as the national youth competition that would determine members of Junior Team USA. The Junior Olympic Gold program was launched in the 1997-98 season, but tragically Dahms did not live to see the inaugural Junior Gold Championships. He died in April 1998 of cancer at age 40.

The prestigious David Dahms Coach of the Year Award annually recognizes a USBC certified coach who has been actively involved in a USBC Youth program and has demonstrated outstanding commitment to coaching, sportsmanship and knowledge of USBC Youth rules for the last seven years or more. Any person or organization with knowledge of an individual's accomplishments in these areas may nominate that individual.

The recipient will be automatically approved as a coach in the People to People Sports Ambassador Program and will have the opportunity to travel internationally as part of a People to People bowling tour. The award recipient also receives an expense-paid trip to the awards ceremony held in conjunction with the USBC Convention in the spring.
