Dear USBC League Officials, Association Officers:

It's that time again... time for the annual Georgia Pepsi USBC Youth Championships tournament.

The Greater Atlanta USBC Association is hosting the 2012 Georgia Pepsi USBC Youth Championships. You are receiving this packet because, according to the best information we can gather, you are an active leader in the USBC. If you are no longer involved in youth bowling, please pass this along to your local USBC officials or your bowling center's program director as soon as possible. We don't want any youth bowlers to be left out!

In this packet, you'll find everything you need to conduct league-level qualifying and to advance your bowlers to state competition. Handicap will be 100% of 210 during the tournament and bowlers in the 12 and above divisions with a 211 or higher average must bowl in the scratch division.

Round 1 of state competition will be held **April 14 – 15, 2012. Divisions 1 - 2 will be at AMF Snellville Lanes**, 2350 Ronald Reagan Pkwy, Snellville, GA 30078, (770) 972-5300. **Divisions 4 - 6 will be at AMF American Lanes**, 885 Flat Shoals Rd, Conyers, GA 30094, (770) 922-2695. The **state finals** will take place Saturday, **April 28, 2012. All divisions 1 - 6 will be at AMF American Lanes**, 885 Flat Shoals Road, Conyers, GA 30094, (770) 922-2695. Coaches will receive confirmation of scheduled bowling dates and times for each bowler, together with addresses, telephone numbers and directions to the bowling center.

League-level qualifying will take place in two (2) qualifying windows encompassing four (4) league sessions. The **advancement ratio** from league level to state competition will be **(1) for every four (4)** entries per division, which will be at least 1 in 4 bowlers including last place ties. **All League members** are counted toward your base figure in determining the number of entries per division. **This includes counting absent bowlers** during the qualifying window.

The first two league sessions used for qualifying must fall between October 23, – November 6, 2011.

The second two league sessions used for qualifying must fall between January 22, – February 5, 2012.

Remember, all scores used for qualifying must be bowled during regular league play. **No pre-bowling or post-bowling scores are allowed.** No tournament scores may be used.

There will be scratch divisions for boys and girls 12 and older. The top two (2) bowlers in the 12-and-above Boys and Girls scratch division will advance to the 2012 North Pointe Junior Gold Championships to be held July 14 – 20, 2012 in Indianapolis, IN. To compete in scratch divisions at the league and state levels, bowlers need not be a member of the USBC Junior Gold program. However, to advance to the North Pointe Junior Gold Championships, state winners must be a USBC Junior Gold program member or must obtain membership prior to the North Pointe Junior Gold event. If a state winner is not eligible for the North Pointe Junior Gold Championships, he/she will retain all awards from the state tournament, but the next eligible bowler will receive the berth in the North Pointe Junior Gold Championships.

Entry fees for state level competition will be: \$22 for Divisions 1 and 2, and \$34 for Divisions 3, 4, 5, and 6.

Please read all information in this package. Besides the information from national headquarters (which includes worksheets and instructions on how to conduct league-level qualifying), you will find:

1. The Georgia Pepsi USBC Youth Championships rules. **You should make copies of these and give one to each and every bowler.** These rules describe the format for state level competition.
2. The state level entry form. Each bowler advancing to the state level must complete one of these. Before you send them off, make sure they are LEGIBLE and that all required blanks are filled in.
3. The Georgia Pepsi USBC Youth Championships dress code. Each bowler advancing to the state level must receive a copy and dress accordingly.

4. The tournament's "No Surprises" policy covering procedures and deadlines for submitting names of alternates for Round 1 of state competition.
5. An alternate entry form. The form is self explanatory. It must be completed and faxed to tournament headquarters in accordance with the "No Surprises" policy.
6. The League Level Worksheet. The form is self explanatory and must be submitted filled in with all league level participants, their initials indicating they accept the division they are in. If the bowlers qualify they need to be ranked (1, 2, 3, etc) based on the highest series score of the qualifying window. The qualifiers must initial that they accept their chance to participate in the Georgia Pepsi USBC Youth Championships tournament.
7. Only approved bowling equipment per USBC standards (Rule 301b) may be used. Bowling ball surfaces may only be altered prior to the first person on the squad throwing a ball, this means all equipment.

You may attach a photocopy of the bowler's current USBC Certification card to his or her state level entry form. Please, do not send multiple pages showing all of your league members' cards! Attach each entrant's card to his/her entry form. The tournament check-in list will show those bowlers who attached photocopies of their certification cards to their entries. Those who don't will have to present their certification cards at check-in or they will not be permitted to bowl.

When qualifying is complete, send a State Level Entry Form for all advancers, plus your league level worksheets, proper entry fees, copies of certification cards for each bowler to Eileen Checkle at the address listed in Rule 5 of the state rules and on the entry form.

November qualifier paper work must be postmarked by midnight on November 21, 2011 or the entries will not be accepted. As per rule 310a entries will be accepted that are postmarked the first post office business day after the above date. Make sure that each bowler initials the worksheet showing that he/she agrees with the division in which they are being entered. A State Level Entry form (copy enclosed) must be completed for each bowler who advances to the state level. I realize you will not be able to furnish the bowler's averages as of January 23, 2012 however; I will need the average verifications with your February qualifiers.

February qualifier paper work must be postmarked by midnight on February 20, 2012 or the entries will not be accepted. As per rule 310a entries will be accepted that are postmarked the first post office business day after the above date. Average verification: league standing sheet as of January 23, 2012 for those qualifiers and those from November window are required in the same mailing. Any information received without the proper fees will be returned and will not be processed until the correction is received. Remember the above deadlines. If they are not met, the youth bowler(s) will be unable to participate.

Letters informing state entrants when and where they bowl in Round 1 will be mailed to you for prompt distribution to your bowlers and will also be available on the Georgia State Youth website www.gastateusbcyouth.com. Those who advance from the first round of state play to the second round will be so advised by letters mailed to the home address listed on entry forms. After the tournament, we hope to mail you complete results of your bowlers' performances.

If you have any questions about the tournament, please contact me. I will return your letter, e-mail, fax or phone call as soon as possible. (E-mail is particularly handy for such communications.)

2012 Georgia Pepsi USBC Youth Championships

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RULES AND FORMAT (September 15, 2011)

All participants must be given a copy of these rules

1. This tournament is certified by the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) (# 4498) governed by USBC rules. Competition is open to all 2011 – 2012 USBC Youth certified members in good standing in Georgia and have not violated USBC Rule 400. Wheelchair and other physically challenged USBC Youth members are also allowed to enter and bowl. Participants must be aware of each competition level in the state and all associated rules, fees and deadlines.
2. Dates for league level qualifying are October 23, – November 6, 2011 and January 22 – February 5, 2012. League advancement is a one-time entry. A bowler can advance only once and from only one league. If any individual who qualified at the league level cannot participate in the state competition, an alternate will be chosen based on order of finish in the same qualifying league division. League-level qualifying must be bowled during regularly scheduled league play. No tournament scores may be used. ****Pre-bowled or post-bowled scores are not allowed****. If a bowler qualifies in more than one league, he/she will advance from the league where the higher series were bowled. For identical qualifying scores the member will advance from the league where the first score was bowled.
3. The **qualifying window average will be the current league average** as of the first date of competition (no minimum games required). Participants in the 12 and above age division must choose either the handicap or scratch division before qualifying. **These athletes must be asked personally about their choice of division.** He or she must remain in that division for the duration of that window. Bowlers are eligible to compete in a different division in a different league during the league level of competition. Advancers out of the league level must remain in the division in which they qualified during all subsequent levels. If a bowler advances out of league level in more than one state, the bowler must declare one state to continue competing before the next competition level. Participation in any level of competition past the league level in more than one state will result in automatic disqualification.
4. Advancement ratio from league level to state competition will be **one (1) for every four (4)** participants per division, which will be at least 1 in 4 bowlers including last place ties. **All League members** are counted toward your base figure in determining the number of entries per division. **This includes counting absent bowlers** during the qualifying window. (Examples: If there are 18 – 21 bowlers in a division, if when you divide your number of bowlers by 4 and get .5 or greater then you get to send that extra bowler, example: 18 divided by 4 equals 4.5 meaning five (5) bowlers may advance to the state Championships. If there are 22 – 25 bowlers in a division, if when you divide your number of bowlers by 4 and get .5 or greater then you get to send that extra bowler, example 22 divided by 4 equals 5.5 meaning that six (6) bowlers may advance to the state Championships.) If there is a tie between the last two qualifiers for advancement, both can advance. **The base number for each division is the number of league members who would have participated in that division.** In all cases at least one (1) person may advance from each division. The advancement ratio (1:4) shall be applied uniformly to all divisions.
5. The **first round** of state competition will take place **April 14 – 15, 2012**, at AMF Snellville Lanes, Snellville, GA, 2350 Ronald Reagan Pkwy, Snellville, GA 30078 (770) 972-5300, for divisions 1 & 2 and at AMF American Lanes, Conyers, GA, 885 Flat Shoals Road, Conyers, GA 30094 (770) 922-2695, for Divisions 3, 4, 5, and 6. The state **finals** will take place Saturday, **April 28, 2012**, at AMF American Lanes, Conyers, GA, 885 Flat Shoals Road, Conyers, GA 30094 (770) 922-2695. Coaches will receive confirmation of scheduled bowling dates and times for each bowler, together with addresses, telephone numbers and directions to the bowling center. This information will also be posted on the Georgia State USBC Youth website at www.gastateusbcyouth.com.

6. Entries after the **November qualifier** should be postmarked by **midnight, November 21, 2011**. Final entries after the **February qualifier** MUST be postmarked by **midnight, February 20, 2012**, to be accepted. As per rule 310a entries will be accepted that are postmarked the first post office business day after the above dates. An entry form for each qualifier (with all information blanks completed) along with the appropriate entry fees must be submitted to the Georgia State USBC Youth treasurer at the below address:

7. Competition will be conducted in the following six (6) divisions based on the participant's age as of August 1, 2011. Bowlers in the 12 and above age division must choose either the handicap or scratch division before league level qualifying begins. **Bowlers in the 12 and above age division who have an entering average of 211 or higher MUST compete in the Scratch division.** Bowlers are not mandated to be USBC Junior Gold members to enter the Scratch Division. However, the bowlers must be USBC Junior Gold members or be eligible and buy membership prior to advancement to the USBC Junior Gold Championships. Participation in the wrong division (age or gender) will lead to automatic disqualification.

Division 1 – 11 and under Girls' Handicap	Division 2 – 11 and under Boys' Handicap
Division 3 – 12 and above Girls' Handicap	Division 4 – 12 and above Boys' Handicap
Division 5 – 12 and above Girls' Scratch	Division 6 – 12 and above Boys' Scratch

Handicap divisions based on 100% of 210
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8. Tournament format is as follows: In the first round of state competition (April 14 – 15), bowlers in the 11-and-under age divisions will bowl three (3) games on the same pair of lanes. Bowlers in the 12-and-above age divisions will bowl six (6) games, moving one pair of lanes after each game. Total Round 1 pinfall plus any applicable handicap will determine qualifiers for the final round of competition. (There will be no carryover of pins from the first round.) The top 10 percent in each division will continue to the final round (April 28), where they will bowl three (3) additional games. Divisions 1 and 2 will not change lanes. Divisions 3 – 6 will move one pair of lanes after each game. Total pinfall plus any applicable handicap for these three games will determine the final five qualifiers in each division who will advance to a stepladder competition. Those bowlers advancing to the final round of state competition on April 28, 2012 will be notified by mail. The top four (4) alternates in each division will also be notified.

9. There are no fees for league-level qualifying, Entry fees for round 1 of state level competition are:

No additional fees are charged for the final round of state competition. All award and scholarship fees will be returned 100 percent within each division. The SMART program will manage all scholarships awarded. The Georgia State Pepsi YBC SMART account number is 8517. The SMART Program can be contacted at 1-800-514-2695, Ext 8292. Fax Ext 8266. Email: smart@bowl.com. (USBC Rules 301d and 309). NOTE: Scholarship funds cannot be utilized by the recipient prior to high school graduation.

10. Each bowler will adhere to the Georgia Pepsi USBC Youth Championships dress code (separate sheet) as set by the tournament committee. The dress code defines suitable attire for boys and girls and prohibits wearing of hats. A bowler who does not abide by the dress code will be asked to change clothes; if the problem still exists, the bowler will be disqualified. League coordinators will receive copies of the dress code. **The tournament director has the final say whether an article of clothing is acceptable or not.**
- a. Bowling shirts, bowling T-shirts with the league/bowling center logo, "official" USBC Youth Jersey, dress shirts, Polo type shirts, and shirts with a butterfly collar that buttons, blouses that button are the only shirts

that are acceptable. Shirts of any kind that are cut low below the neck are NOT acceptable. Shirts of any kind that show the mid area of the body are NOT acceptable.

- b. Dress slacks of cotton, rayon, polyester or double-knits, dress denims or jeans looking newly purchased, and Capri pants provided the length is below the knee are acceptable attire. All pants must be worn about the waist. Clothing with holes, frays, torn, parachutes pants, shorts, sweats, hats, skirts, culottes (women's short's resembling a skirt) or zupas (pants with elastic cuffs) of any kind are NOT permitted.
 - c. No smoking by players or spectators will be permitted inside the bowling centers during the tournament.
 - d. Youth bowlers are prohibited from wearing apparel or using bowling equipment depicting alcohol, tobacco, gambling, illegal substances or inappropriate language/gestures during tournament play. (USBC Playing Rule 301b).
11. Only approved bowling equipment per USBC standards may be used. Check on Bowl.com on the "Equipment Specifications" link under USBC Departments (See new Rule 301b). Bowling ball surfaces may only be altered prior to the first person on the squad throwing a ball, this means all equipment. Rules 17a, 18.
 12. No substitutes will be permitted. Alternates may be used for bowlers who are not present at squad time. Alternates may be chosen only from the same division as the bowler who has dropped out and in the order of finish at the prior level. Replacement of alternates will NOT be made on the assigned day of bowling. Exceptions will be made only under dire extenuating circumstances, and then only at the discretion of the tournament coordinator. Use the Alternate Entry Form and submit to the tournament director no later than the 9:00 PM the day before competition.
 13. In state competition, bowlers will be allowed two (2) practice balls on each of their starting lanes before the first game. Excess practice balls will be penalized by a corresponding number of zeroes for frames in the first game and could result in disqualification. No practice balls are permitted before subsequent games.
 14. If no replacements have been made, because the bowler has informed the tournament director that he/she will be late, then the bowler arriving late shall begin play and the score shall count beginning with the frame being bowled. Frames missed shall be credited with a zero (0). A bowler not present and ready to bowl when it is his/her turn will receive a zero (0) for that frame.
 15. Averages used for state level entry shall be the bowler's highest current certified league average as of January 23, 2012, with a minimum of 21 games. If the minimum number of games has not been met, the bowler must present a league standing sheet closest to the date of competition or the bowler will bowl scratch. NOTE: Entries after the February qualifier window will not be accepted without a copy of the league standing sheet as of January 23, 2012. All averages are verified by a current certified league standing sheet. If a bowler has a sport league average and not a standard league average then Rule # 202b will apply. If a sport league average is used then indicate on the State Level Entry Form next to the average block.
 16. **Handicap will be 100% of the difference between the bowler's average and 210.** The qualifying window average will be the current league average as of the first date of the league level qualifying. No minimum games are required for league level qualifying.
 17. Only bowlers and tournament officials shall be permitted in the bowling area.
 18. In state finals competition, all ties will be broken by a one game roll-off (when necessary to determine advancement). If a tie still exists, it will be broken by an additional ninth and tenth frame roll-off with bowlers receiving one-tenth of their handicap per frame where applicable. (USBC Rule 326a).
 19. Claims for errors in scoring or general playing rules must be made to the tournament director no later than the start of the next block or 30 minutes after the completion of the tournament. The tournament director shall decide upon questionable errors. All other protests must be submitted in writing to the tournament director before the awards are presented. Under this rule, each protest must be specific in itself. Awards will be presented immediately following the completion of the stepladder competition. Rules 327a, 327b, 327c, 328 and 329 apply.

20. Symbolic awards will be given on a 1-in-10 ratio. Each of the top five finishers in each of the six divisions will receive a scholarship; that is, all bowlers competing in the stepladder finals will receive scholarships.
21. The top two (2) bowlers in the 12-and-above Girls' and Boys' Scratch Divisions will advance to the 2012 North Pointe Junior Gold Championships to be held July 14 – 20, 2012 in Indianapolis, IN. They must be USBC Junior Gold members to advance to the North Pointe Junior Gold Championship or purchase a USBC Junior Gold membership prior to the championships. USBC will waive the \$200.00 entry fee for these athletes. These athletes will compete for additional scholarships available to all athletes at the championships, as well as other prizes and awards. All U.S. citizens are vying for a spot on USBC Junior Team USA 2013 to represent the United States in national and international competition. If the Scratch Division Champion or runners-up are unwilling or unable to become a USBC Junior Gold member and will not advance to the Championships, the athlete will still retain all awards from the state, but the berth to the Championships will be awarded to the next eligible athlete.
22. All advancers to North Pointe Junior Gold Championships must be accompanied by a parent, guardian or coach. Also, the advancer must remain in Indianapolis, IN for approximately seven days.
23. Eligible advancers must agree to bowl in the North Pointe Junior Gold Championships, or, failing to do so, agree to waive all rights. Replacements will be selected based on order of finish in their division at state competition. Replacements will incur all costs associated with changing the airline ticket, if applicable. If the advancer decides not to attend North Pointe Junior Gold Championships, the state scholarship won may be withdrawn. The decision will be made by the state scholarship committee.
24. All matters not covered by these rules and regulations shall be determined by the Georgia Pepsi USBC Youth Championships Tournament Committee. The National Pepsi USBC Youth Championships Tournament Committee reserves the right to accept or reject any participant.

Tournament dress code

No hats will be worn during play. Only regulation bowling shoes may be worn.

Youth bowlers are prohibited from wearing apparel or using bowling equipment depicting alcohol, tobacco, gambling, illegal substances or inappropriate language/gestures during tournament play. (USBC Playing Rule 301b).

Boys

Bowling shirts, bowling center issued T-shirts with the league/bowling center logo, "official" USBC Youth Jersey, dress shirts, Polo type shirts, and shirts with a butterfly collar that buttons are the only shirts that are acceptable. Shirts may have sponsor's name on back. Display of bowling emblems/awards encouraged.

Dress slacks of cotton, rayon, polyester or double-knits, dress denims or jeans looking newly purchased.

Girls

Bowling shirts, bowling center issued T-shirts with the league/bowling center logo, "official" USBC Youth Jersey, dress shirts, Polo type shirts, and shirts with a butterfly collar that buttons, blouses that button are the only shirts that are acceptable. Shirts may have sponsor's name on back. Display of bowling emblems/awards encouraged.

Dress slacks of cotton, rayon, polyester or double-knits, dress denims or jeans looking newly purchased, and Capri pants provided the length is below the knee are acceptable attire.

Not permitted (Boys and Girls): Shirts of any kind that are cut low below the neck, tank tops, fishnet or see-through shirts are NOT acceptable. Shirts of any kind that show the mid area of the body are NOT acceptable. All pants must be worn about the waist. Clothing with holes, frays, torn, parachutes pants, shorts, sweats, hats, skirts, culottes (women's short's resembling a skirt) or zupas (pants with elastic cuffs) of any kind are NOT permitted.

Exceptions: Any requests for exceptions to the dress code (i.e. medical) must be presented to the tournament director with a doctor's statement.

Surprises: a luxury we can no longer afford

To All Pepsi Coordinators, Coaches:

A tournament that does not run on time and in an orderly manner is not a fair tournament. We are committed to starting every squad of the 2012 Georgia Pepsi USBC Youth Championships on time. We expect a very large number of bowlers again this year, and nearly all of the squads will be chocked full.

Therefore, replacement of entrants by alternates will NOT be made on the assigned day of bowling. Exceptions will be made only under dire extenuating circumstances, and then only at the discretion of the tournament director.

If you need to make a substitution for a player scheduled to bowl on Saturday, April 14 you must fax / email an **"Alternate Entry Form"** to the Tournament Director, Kevin Dimuzio at (478) 926-5703 **by 9 PM Friday April 13. Please call before and after faxing to verify I received your fax.** These forms can also be emailed to me.

If you need to make a substitution for a player scheduled to bowl on Sunday, April 15, you must fax / email an **"Alternate Entry Form"** to the Tournament Director, Kevin Dimuzio at (478) 926-5703 **by 9 PM Saturday, April 14. Please call before and after faxing to verify I received your fax.** These forms can also be emailed to me.

Please make a follow-up call to Tournament Director, Kevin Dimuzio (478) 397-4873(cell), (478) 218-4629 (home), or an e-mail message to me at kdimuzio@windstream.net. A follow-up call will help insure that the information has been received.

The **"Alternate Entry Form"** is included in this packet. (Make photocopies of the form in case you need more than one.) Fill in all information. If an alternate does not appear on the league-qualifier worksheets you sent earlier and on the January 23, 2012 league-standing sheet you provided, you must fax documents that show the information.

At check-in, the alternate will have to show a USBC membership card, be properly dressed per the tournament dress code. The alternate must bowl in the squad and on the lanes assigned to the original entrant.

Advise your bowlers that if they realize they will not be able to come to the state tournament because of illness, injury, family emergency or any other reason, they should let you know immediately so you can make arrangements for an alternate to come.

Example: If Johnny breaks a leg on the Wednesday before the tournament and you wish to send an alternate, the tournament director should be notified by fax immediately – and by the above deadlines at the latest.

A bowler who shows up at check-in and says, "I'm here to replace so-and-so", or a coach who shows up with several children and says, "I need to enter these alternates", will be turned away.

Finally, all bowlers must bowl at the assigned times or not at all. With full squads, we have no leeway to change squads.

To provide the best service to all players in a tournament as large as this one, we must enforce this "no surprises" policy.

We appreciate your cooperation.
